I like the moment of silence at the beginning allowing students the independence to either recite the pledge, meditate, pray or express their patriotism however they prefer.

Regarding Bible or religious classes as mandatory electives in public schools -- I know the law was passed that said it was mandatory public schools offer religious electives. I'm not opposed to this - I think it's ok for students who have a faith to have a class that is appealing to them. The classes MUST be a full range of faiths though and they HAVE to be electives only. I am however opposed to this being a slippery slope into required religious classes to graduate.
